

## Guidelines for contributions

Through its numerous papers, EuroCité promotes citizenship participation in the European debate and aims at providing a fertile thinking ground for political leaders. The articles are meant to inform non-specialist readers, produce a critical analysis, and when possible practical proposals.

Most articles' length comes between 1,500 and 2,500 words.
